Superintendent's present reported that they try and improve the grades they receive and one of the ways they do that is to increase the number of student's taking the ACT or other standardized tests. Mr. Szabrak presented the "Career Readiness Endorsement", a packet that will be given to Career students interested in directly entering the workforce. The packet contains a list of attainable Readiness goals that a student must complete, with signatures from the student, counselor and Endorsement business. The goal is to finish the packet as early in 12<sup>th</sup> grade as possible. Ms. Friel then mentioned that Midwest Fabricating is holding a Manufacturing Day on October 5<sup>th</sup> and would welcome students in the Career Readiness program. There was a discussion on the checklist represented in the packet, statements from everyone that soft skills are necessary There was discussion on how state testing can derail a student's graduation rates. There was group discussion on how the packet was beneficial and should be implemented throughout all of the districts. A motion was made by Mr. Szabrak, seconded by Ms. Buckley to approve the implement the Career Readiness Endorsement packet. All ave Motion carried.
